
BPAA Brief History

2.2 Key Tasks Committee:

Although specific committee members are allocated tasks, all committee members may take the initiative in helping with other committee members roles. The roles below are above and beyond roles allocated by state chapters. Each individual committee member will only have limited authority in what can or cannot be done. All decisions, especially where money or commitment of the BPAA is involved, needs to have approval from the majority of the Committee at a Committee meeting.



2.2.1 EVENTS - A) Education and Training Development Sub-Committee

Accountable for:

Reviewing and redevelopment of the current Continuing Professional Development Program if necessary.

Reviewing current Education and training content and redevelopment of materials if necessary.

Presenting programs if/when available.

Co-ordination of promotional material regarding CPD and training resources with the Marketing and promotion subcommittee.

Responsibilities:

Recommending to the Committee the subject, numbers, locations and topics for CPD events.

Assisting the Executive Officer to develop a budget for each event.

Assisting the Executive Officer who will book venues, assist in promoting the event, provide administrative services and process ticket sales etc.

2.2.1 EVENTS - B) Major Events and Conferences

Accountable for:

Details i.e., date, length, state (location), venue, program development, guest speakers, sponsors, budget.

Reviewing event.

Co-ordination of promotional material regarding Major events with the Marketing and promotion subcommittee.

Responsible for:

Recommending to the Committee the date, location, program topics.

Assisting the Executive Officer to develop a budget for each event.

Assisting the Executive Officer who will book venues, assist in promoting the event, assisting with program development, provide administrative services and processing ticket sales etc.

Ensuring timelines are being met

Arranging mechanism for people to volunteer to help with events.

2.2.2 - GOVERNANCE AND COMPLIANCE

Accountable for:

- Ensuring all legal obligations are met.
- Ensuring all financial obligations are met.

- Ensuring all ethical responsibilities are met.
- Ensuring all members act withing the code of conduct
- Assisting the President
- Assisting the Treasurer as per Rule 48 regularly review the accounts and Financial records of the Association



2.2.3 – ADVOCACY

Accountable for:

- Representing the BPAA on various committees outside of the BPAA.
- Negotiating with industry best practice guidelines and standards
- Networking with industry stakeholders for the betterment of the BPAA.

- Attending meetings on behalf of BPAA
- Liaising with BPAA Committee reasonable responses where required



2.2.4 - PROMOTION AND MARKETING

Accountable for:

- Ensuring fortnightly newsletter goes out on time
- Keeping Website up to date
- Keeping all social media is up to date/monitoring and responding when necessary
- Providing third party organisations with information, ensuring the BPAA maintains significance in the industry.
- Actively campaigning for free or inexpensive advertising in journals, on radio or on TV.

- Researching and providing information for Newsletters, Website, Facebook and Tumblr and other third-party organizations, publications and journals.
- o Researching material to ensure its appropriate and timelines fit with the newsletter etc.
- Sending information to the Executive Officer in a timely manner, to be included in the newsletter and other forms of media.



2.2.5 – MEMBERSHIP SERVICES

Accountable for:

- Organising and hosting regular state based or national meetings (face to face or via Zoom)
- Ensuring Membership database is up to date (in line with Rules 18 and 47)
- Encouraging non-members to get involved

- Creating and publishing an annual Calendar of Meetings
- Liaising with Executive Officer regarding current members
- Create new opportunities for people to want to get involved.



2.2.6 - SPONSORSHIP

Accountable for:

- Working with industry to develop relationships with stakeholders
- Working with Executive Officer, in actively pursuing sponsors.

- Promoting the BPAA to potential sponsors
- Introducing new potential sponsors to the organisation
