- Invested in a training facility to ensure a legacy for the Project.



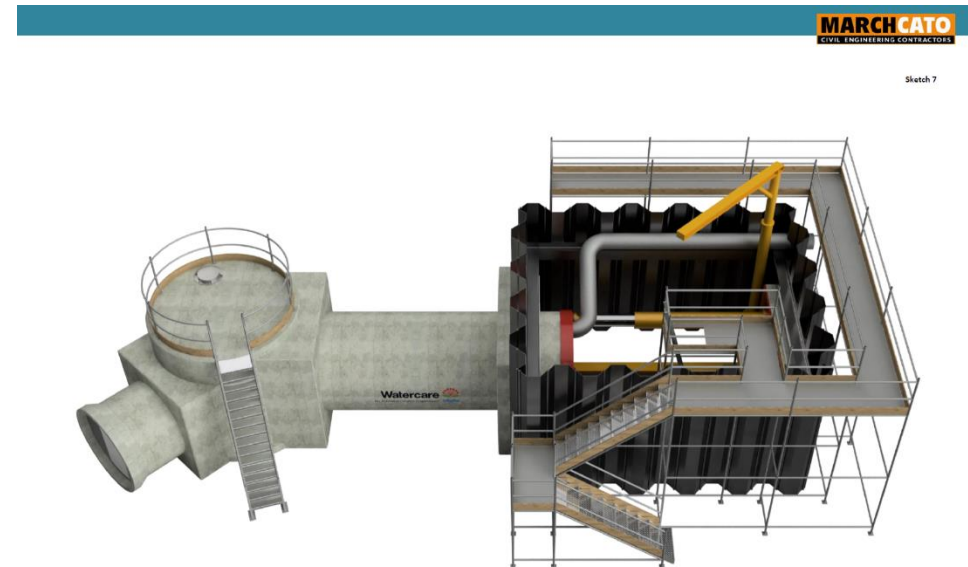
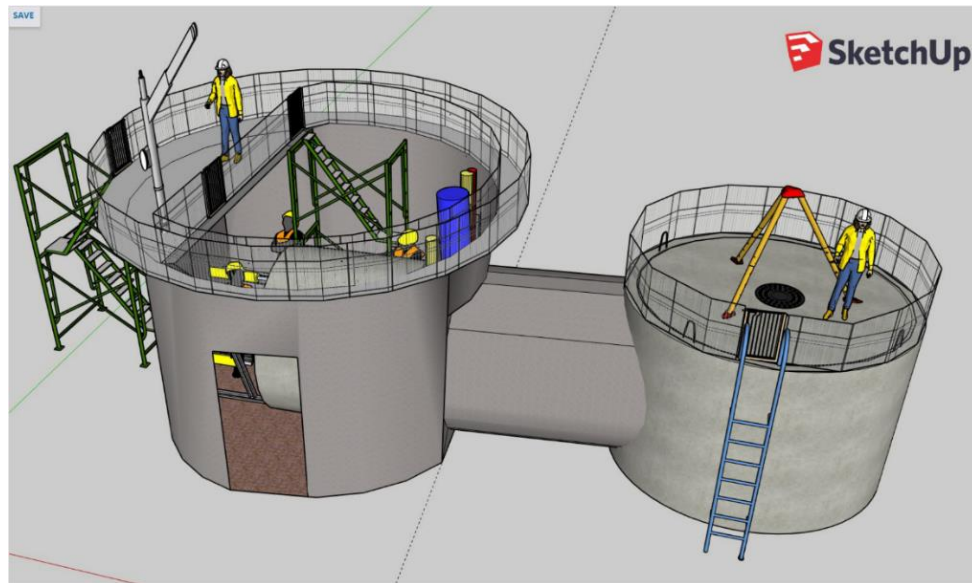
Watercare's Role

- Developed Watercare's Training Campus



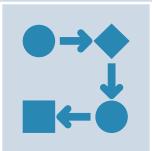
